Recommendations:

1

Incorporate intercultural education into school curricula at all levels, stressing the significance of understanding and respecting various cultures from an early age.

2

Encourage interdisciplinary research projects that explore innovative educational strategies for promoting dialogue and tolerance among young people, drawing from fields such as psychology, sociology, and education studies.

3

Create mentorship programs that connect young students with seasoned educators and researchers, offering opportunities for guidance, collaboration, and engagement in intercultural projects.

4

Allocate resources to develop and distribute educational materials, including online courses, multimedia content, and interactive platforms, that foster cross-cultural learning and cultivate empathy and understanding.



5

Advocate for the use of technology and digital tools in education to create immersive learning environments that expose students to diverse cultures and perspectives from around the world.

6

Support initiatives that encourage student exchange programs, cultural exchanges, and international collaborative research projects, enhancing cross-cultural dialogue and cooperation.

7

Provide funding and resources for research on the effectiveness of educational interventions in promoting tolerance, diversity appreciation, and intercultural understanding among youth.

8

Strengthen collaborations between educational institutions, community organizations, and government bodies to design comprehensive educational initiatives that tackle societal issues related to prejudice, discrimination, and intolerance.

Next Edition Goal

1

Expand the reach and impact of the conference by attracting a broader and more diverse range of participants, including scholars, researchers, policymakers, educators, students, and representatives from civil society organizations.

2

Deepen the conference's thematic focus to address emerging issues and challenges in intercultural dialogue, tolerance, and cooperation, such as the effects of globalization, technological developments, and social transformation.

3

Fortify partnerships with international organizations, academic institutions, and government agencies to pool



4

Increase the engagement of young people in the conference by offering dedicated sessions, workshops, and networking opportunities aimed at empowering future leaders and advocates for change.

5

Integrate innovative formats and interactive sessions into the conference program, such as panel discussions, roundtable debates, and hands-on learning activities, to encourage meaningful dialogue and exchange of ideas.

As Director General of NII from 2004, he introduced a reform plan dividing the institute into insurance and social clusters, enhancing services for the elderly, disabled, and children.



ABSTRACT

This research paper explores the transforming potential of integrating translation practices into educational curricula as a strategic approach to engage youth in bridging cultural divides and enhancing tolerance. By positioning translation as a strategic approach that acts as a medium for deep cultural exchange, the discussion will outline methods and techniques for leveraging translation not merely as a linguistic tool, but as a gateway to cultivating global citizenship and intercultural competence. Successful case studies and innovative pedagogical approaches are examined to demonstrate how young learners in my classes engage in translating experiences and exhibit an appreciation for diversity and a nuanced understanding of global cultures. In practice, a mixed method analysis is applied to the writing products of students to explore how they have successfully bridged cultural differences between dissimilar languages. Further, the paper addresses the impact of translating key cultural and religious texts on young minds, showing how this exposure can challenge preconceptions and encourage a more tolerant worldview. Hence, a survey is conducted among young translation practitioners to evaluate their experiences, revealing that they are increasingly inclined to accept and adopt diverse worldview conceptions as a result of their engagement with translation. Ultimately, the goal is to formulate a robust translation curriculum that enhances a profound understanding and respect for cultural diversity. By embedding translation practices within the educational system, we aim to empower the next generation with the skills and empathy necessary to navigate and contribute positively to a multicultural world.

ABSTRACT

Transformative education has recently triggered many discussions and debates and promised better learning outcomes. Mezirow (1978, 1990, 1991, 1995, 1997, 2000); Cranton (1994, 2002); Taylor (1998); Merriam (2001) have published articles and books on various aspects of the transformation experience. Transformative education is a process by which our taken-for-granted frames of reference are transformed by making them more inclusive, open, emotionally capable of change, and reflective (Mezirow, 2000). Attempts have been made to identify the factors that trigger perspective transformation, participants' roles, course contents, learning environments, and the evident common themes in the transformation experience. Transformation experiences include changes in the way individuals perceive themselves, others, and the world around them. To investigate the impact of transformative education on students' development of effective communication behaviours for better intercultural understanding, a postcourse interview is conducted with a sample of MA students at the ENCG Business School-Marrakesh, Cadi Ayad University, Morocco. Appropriate qualitative content analysis of participants' answers and reactions to interview questions is used. The main reason for conducting content analysis is to see whether a communication course on Soft Skills/21st-century skills can provide an appropriate environment for transformational learning that may trigger changes in students' perception of the world around them, and allow them to improve their communication behaviors for better interaction with others. Participants reportedly believe the course has allowed them to reconsider previous assumptions, adopt more effective communication behaviors, and develop essential transferable skills for better intercultural encounters across borders.

With a focus on the rise of mega-cities, the article argues that urban centers hold unique potential for bridging intercultural gaps through "soft" diplomacy. By analyzing sistercity agreements and city networks, the paper argues that cities can shape a new regional narrative of solidarity. Case studies of Abu Dhabi, Essaouira, and Haifa demonstrate how city diplomacy can promote tolerance and multiculturalism. This paper seeks to investigate the contributions of faith traditions to economic thought, offering fresh perspectives on foundational questions that govern economic behavior: How do we define property and efficiency? How do humans make economic decisions? And how do these concepts mediate the relationships between individuals, and between humanity and the divine? The paper will examine key principles of Jewish economic thought and their relevance in addressing these timeless questions. It will also position these principles within a broader comparative framework, analyzing parallels and divergences with Islamic jurisprudence, particularly through the lens of Al-Ghazali's legal philosophy. Al-Ghazali's influential framework, which emphasizes the preservation of life, lineage, religion, knowledge, and property, serves as a cornerstone for understanding the theological and legal rationalizations that underpin some of Islamic thought. This framework also profoundly influenced Christian theology and subsequently, Western legal and economic traditions. By juxtaposing Al-Ghazali's thought with the legal and economic philosophy of Jewish thinkers such as Maimonides, this paper will explore how the rationalization of divine law is not merely a theological pursuit but also a legal and economic one. Both traditions grapple with questions of how divine principles are translated into actionable laws that govern human interactions, with implications extending into modern economic practices. In some cases, they can even offer out-of-the-box ideas to address the economic predicaments of our time. This, this paper urges scholars to consider how the integration of theological insights can contribute to rethinking modern economic systems.

ABSTRACT

This paper aims to fill the existing literature by providing insights on how tolerance policies affect UAE citizens and residents in their day-to-day lives and the UAE's approach to tolerance as the foundation for the country's multicultural society. UAE, hosts more than 200 nationalities and has developed various policies and programs that support the integration of people from different backgrounds. The main aims include understanding the MOT programs, identifying residents' perception of tolerance, and identifying how government policies influence social cohesion in a pluralistic society. Both convenience and theoretical sampling approaches were adopted, while data were analyzed using Grounded Theory by gathering data from the MOT and the UAE population. Focused interviews offered a qualitative means of data collection that were analyzed for emerging tolerance patterns. The study's conclusion shows how the UAE government is in line with promoting tolerance among people in the country. Although there are well-documented advances in addressing diversity issues, the study revealed that there are areas with policy recommendations that could enhance the integration of multicultural citizens. Thus, the UAE case offers a best practice for other countries to follow regarding tolerance promotion. However, constant review and modification of the policy are crucial due to the rising societal demands, particularly in preserving the nation's unity in diversity. Having in mind the importance of the Tolerance Framework, TES theory should be developed further in order to introduce the connection between theory and practice, to provide a systematic way of developing tolerance, improving people's quality of life, and building an inclusive society.
